After long months of site work and cablelaying, it's finally time for the turbines to arrive on site. A delivery programme has been in preparation for some time, involving police, roads departments and specialist hauliers. There is no denying it - these things are BIG, but careful

NB: Nacelle is the turbine housing, Int Trafo is the internal transformer

Once the turbines are erected, the process of commissioning and energisation begins. Ironically we require a period of low wind speed to lift the turbines into position so it's difficult to say exactly how long this phase of the work will take, however we do expect to be fully energised by Christmas.

CHARTER REBOOT MEETING

A group of 40 gathered for a lively meeting in Neilston Primary School on 27th September, with all local councillors present and chaired by ClIr Tony Buchanan. Danny McKendry, ERC Principal Regeneration Officer and the Council's lead on the Charter process, acknowledged that work on the Charter implementation phase had not been taken forward as quickly as everyone would want.

In view of this, ERC had commissioned NDT, on behalf of the Town Team, to progress a short piece of work. The brief is to produce a development plan for the Charter, to organize this 'reboot' meeting and bi-monthly Town Team sessions, produce a display for local information, and bring forward some suggestions for quick win projects as evidence of progress being made.

Suzie Smith, ERC Young Peoples Service, spoke of her enthusiasm to have young people fully involved in the Charter process and welcomed the call to see provision for young people embedded in the ongoing development plans. She spoke of a media project beginning that very evening, exploring young people's perceptions of Neilston and their place in it. Pauline Gallacher presented an update on local developments that have already contributed to Charter outcomes.

The display supporting the presentation (Neilston Town Charter - Where are we now?) is in Neilston Library until 22nd November.

A discussion followed, raising issues such as progress on the school gates, the choice of 'quick

win' projects, the status of the Charter within the local planning context, the prospects for Kingston Playing fields and Neilston Juniors' hopes for their future development.


